This application will be reviewed by members of the Admissions Subcommittee, which consists of at least one volunteer member of the QuEST Committee, at least two current QuEST interns, and the QuEST Coordinator. The Admissions committee will then select applicants for phone interviews, after which we select ten or twelve finalists who will be interviewed by the sites. Your resume and responses to the Interests and Experience section will be sent to potential placement sites at that time. (Community Life and Beliefs essays will not be forwarded to the sites, but will be read by the Admissions Committee only.) A matching process, based upon service site selections and intern preferences, will determine final placement in the program.

A complete application includes this coveragepage, answers to the 9 short essay questions, 2 letters of reference, and a current resume. **The application must be received by 5pm (pst) March 1, 2010.**

9. Please discuss your basic moral and/or spiritual beliefs.

Please include two letters of reference with your application, one should be professional, one personal. Reference letters should include the nature and length of your relationship. Ask them to comment (as they are able) on your emotional strengths, your motivation and initiative, your skill in interpersonal relationships, your strengths and weaknesses, and your ability to work independently.
