"The staff members who knew the owners wishes but didn't work to fulfill them will get a sever punishment, whereas the one who didn't know them, even though deserving of a severe punishment- will get off with a milder correction. From those who have been given much, much will be required; from those who have been entrusted much, much more will be asked." - Luke 12: 35-48
