Greetings! Thank you for applying to GSV; we look forward to getting to know you. Please keep in mind that you can contact us with any questions you may have about this process; we are always happy to talk with you! Call us at **718-943-7488** or email gsv@gsvolunteers.org. As you complete your application, here are a few things to note:

- **We have a priority deadline of November 28th.** After our priority deadline, applications will be received on a rolling basis until all positions are filled. Applications are processed and placements are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. We encourage you to apply as early as possible.
- A completed application packet **MUST** include:
 - **General application form (attached)**
 - **Self-reference form (attached)**
 - **[Common Reference Form](#) (available on our website) to be completed by 3 references**
 - **Resume (see application for instructions on resume)**
 - **Official Undergraduate/Graduate college transcript(s) (unofficial transcripts will be accepted prior to graduating)**
- For all responses, **help us get to know you** as much as possible! **All of your input in this application process – including your written application and our interview – is held in strict confidentiality by GSV staff and supervisors.** Please be as specific as you can in your responses; feel free to use the additional pages if you need more space. If possible, download the application, process/save it as a Word file, and email it once it is completed.
- **At least one of your three reference forms must be completed by a former employer or supervisor. Please do not have any family members or friends fill out a reference.** Please be sure to complete the waiver at the top of each reference form, and then ask your references to **promptly** send the completed form directly to the GSV office.
- Please do not wait to send all of your application materials together; send in each part of the packet as you complete it. Once we receive your complete application packet, it will be reviewed and we will be in touch with you to set up an interview if necessary.
- Our application process is typically as follows:
 - GSV receives and reviews the application.
 - We conduct a phone interview with the applicant. We may also invite them to speak with former (or current) volunteers in their site placement(s) of interest.
 - Once a site has been mutually agreed upon, the applicant interviews with the staff of the site placement.
 - If the applicant and the site agree that the placement and program is a good fit, the applicant is accepted to GSV.
- Although this application places no real obligation on either you or the Good Shepherd Volunteers, it indicates a serious intention on your part to join GSV. Should you decide to withdraw your application, please notify us immediately.

- 2) GSV's Mission Statement is, *"Good Shepherd Volunteers recruits, educates, and supports full-time volunteers who use their God-given talents to serve women, adolescents, and children affected by poverty, violence, and neglect in domestic and international placements. Our volunteers live out the four tenets of Social Justice, Simplicity, Spirituality, and Community, and are encouraged to maintain a commitment to these principles for a lifetime. Good Shepherd Volunteers, founded by the Sisters of the Good Shepherd, is dedicated to honoring the sisters' core values of Individual Dignity, Mercy, Reconciliation, and Zeal."* How do your personal beliefs and values relate to the mission of GSV? - 11) At most of our placements, volunteers are exposed to vulnerable populations affected by various forms of violence, trauma, or neglect. Have you observed or experienced violence, trauma, or neglect? If so, how did it affect you and how have you coped with it?
- 12) Our placement sites have a wide variety of ministries with women, children, and adolescents. Our placements include education, foster care, youth counseling, fair trade, domestic violence, juvenile justice, and public policy. Is there an area of work that you are particularly drawn to at this time?
