The application deadline for domestic service opportunities is June 1st. International service applications are due February 1st. Please call the GSV Office at (888) 668-6GSV ext. 780 to inquire about open positions after these dates.

International candidates are required to participate in a Discernment Weekend in March or April prior to acceptance. Cross Cultural Training for international volunteers occurs in the summer. All domestic and international volunteers begin their service with GSV at August Orientation.
