

**Rostro de Cristo  
Post-Retreat Evaluation**

The purpose of the Rostro de Cristo retreat is to expose people from North America to the spiritual, physical and emotional realities of the people from Duran, Ecuador. This is done through building relationships with the people of the neighborhood and from the surrounding communities. Each retreatant is expected to live his / her life as simply as possible while living in the retreat house. While each person takes something away from this experience, it is the sincere hope of the program that the retreatants are able to deepen their faith in God and their commitment to issues of poverty for all people.

1. Amount and quality of information received prior to coming to Ecuador.  
Do believe you were well informed about the program before coming to Ecuador? What else might the volunteer coordinator do to improve preparation?
  
2. Safety and security of the program  
Do you believe all necessary precautions were made in regards to transportation, the house, and the neighborhood? Do you have any concerns?
  
3. Guidance from the group leader  
Did the group leader receive you warmly to Ecuador? Was the orientation informative and appropriate to your experience? If any problems arose, do you believe they were addressed adequately and timely? Was the group leader available when needed? Was the group leader an appropriate role model for the retreatants?
  
4. Daily schedule and site visits  
The daily schedule is purposely set-up to keep you in the neighborhood each day in order to build relationships with the community. Did your schedule accomplish this? Any comments on any particular component of the site visits? Should they be repeated?
  
5. Spirituality of the program  
The name of the program is Rostro de Cristo. Did the components of the program allow your group to see this face in the people? Was faith and spirituality adequately addressed? Did your

group participate in daily prayer and reflection? Any suggestions?
