You are a blue collar worker, struggling to survive, but your hard work has paid off and you are now considered to be “middle class.” Recognizing your unity with others, you are free to share your wealth with whomever you choose, whenever you choose.

You are a middle class person who keeps trying to better yourself. You are afraid to give money away, fearing it will cost you your own security and deprive you from improving your status in life. To maintain this, the plight of the poor is not within your consciousness. Therefore, you DO NOT, under any circumstances share your wealth or your food.

You do not need to become one with the poor you are the poor. You are the working poor, barely making enough to survive. You are free to ask others to assist you and to give away what you have.

You are an alcoholic who spends half of the little you have to support your habit. Because of your addiction, you do not know how to ask help... therefore, you can only receive what is offered you, without solicitation.

You are a wo/man who is homeless. You are the poorest of the poor. You have no money, and may ONLY eat the leftovers of others.

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You are a lower-middle class individual with three school-age children. You seldom eat out, as it is a luxury you can't

often enjoy. You have several loans to pay off and purchase your own private medical insurance. You are very conscious of the needs of the less fortunate and would like to help as much as you can, but are constrained because of the financial situation of your own family. Use your own discretion about how much of your money you can give to those around you.

You are an upper-middle class wo-man in your late fifties. You have worked hard in life to get to where you are, and you have a certain amount of disdain for those who don't "seem" to try as hard as you did. You put three kids through college, the last just graduated last year. You now have more financial freedom since tuition bills no longer come, and are considering an early retirement. You have the means to give away, but are more inclined to spend on yourself and your family. You can give up to two dollars away.

You are a middle class wo/man. You are a single 26 year old, doing well, little financial responsibility beyond your own needs. You go out often with friends and are liberal in your spending. You are aware of the needs of those around you,

and have good intentions, but often fail to act on them. You are a churchgoer and put money in the collection on occasion. The person on your left is THE CHURCH, which by tradition asks for 10% of your income. Use your judgement about how much you tithe.
