RESPONSE TO READING:

Right Side: Blessed are you if you have compassion

on the poor and rejected people in our

world.

Response: God of Justice, hear our prayer!

Left Side: Blessed are you if you possess only

what you need, not what you want, and share everything else with those who have less. (Response)

Right Side: Blessed are you if you feel pain at

events, policies, structures that destroy the dignity of people, depriving them of their needs and human rights. (Response)

Left Side: Blessed are you if you reject violence

in all its forms and rely on the power of love and truth as a way to actively resist social evil. (Response)

Right Side: Blessed are you if you are so passionately

committed to the promotion of justice that you are willing to be imprisoned for its sake. (Response)

Left Side: Blessed are you if you forgive your

enemies and break down all artificial barriers between yourself and others.

(Response)

Right Side: Blessed are you if your love is selfless

and your commitment to God and a trans-

formed world is single-minded.

(Response)

Left Side: Blessed are you if you suffer for the

sake of peace, peace in your heart, in your relationships and in our world.

(Response)

Right Side: Blessed are you if you experience per-

secution, rejection, imprisonment for the sake of the Gospel. (Response)

CLOSING PRAYER:

Leader: Lord God, we know that You always hear the cry of the poor. We ask that You heal those who suffer.

All: Raise up men and women among us to be signs of hope, who will help to create the systems and structures that will be sources of life.

We ask Your Blessing upon us as we gather here today to reflect on the hungers of human families in our world.

May we never grow complacent in the face of suffering.

As we come to You poor in spirit, may we be filled with the riches that only You can give.
