SATURDAY MORNING PRAYER

SCRIPTURE The Early Christian Community (ACTS II, 42-47 IV, 29-31)

These remained faithful to the teaching of the apostles, to their unity, to the breaking of bread and to the prayers. The many miracles and signs worked through the apostles made a deep impression on everyone. The faithful all lived together and owned everything in common; they sold their goods and possessions and shared out the proceeds among themselves according to what each one needed.

They went as a body to the Temple every day but met in their houses for the breaking of bread; they shared their food gladly and generously; they praised God and were looked up to by everyone. Day by day the Lord added to their community those destined to be saved.

And together they prayed 'Lord, help your servants to proclaim your miracles and marvels through the name of your holy servant Jesus.'

REFLECTION

Share your gift of song, your smile, your recipe for falafel....share you thirst for understanding with an [elder]. Never stop sharing. Share a sunny afternoon, a rainy morning, a quiet sunrise. Share your home with someone who doesn't have one right now. Share your clothes. Break your cookie into pieces and share them with everyone at the table. You are as you share....
