

Additionally, we hosted 75 online member events with 45 unique attendees and 9 in-person gatherings, reaching over 100 unique attendees. 

Growing Participation, Expanding Support





This chart breaks down the various sources of CVN's revenue, including membership dues, advertising, foundation grants, conferences, and contributions, all of which sustain our mission and growth.


